## **RE: THIRD YEAR REVIEW FEEDBACK**

Per Promotion and Tenure Guidelines, it is our honor and privilege to be part of your third-year review. As stated in the guideline document, the third-year review grants you a mentoring opportunity by peers in your department. After having individually and collectively examined your record of scholarship, teaching and service, we are happy to rate your portfolio as extremely well done and that you are making satisfactory progress towards promotion and tenure. We provide more specific comments in the sections below for both you and the Chair of the DSAP, Dr. Amy Klinger.

## Scholarship

In the years under review, 2016 -2019, you have successfully engaged in scholarship in your field of gifted education. Your scholarly input at the state level is impressive with an average of two presentations a year at your professional association meetings. The juried publications are increasing and you have steadily submitted articles for publication. Your reflections on scholarship acknowledge these areas of strength as we as some areas of improvement, which include more national and regional level scholarship activities, for example Mid-West Regional Education Association (MWERA ) and peer reviewed publications.

Dr. Groman's membership in the Ashland University Research and Writing Community, along with your daily commitment for scholarship work, demonstrates your willingness to grow professionally.

We recommend you continue to pursue your passion and depth of research in creativity and transpersonal psychology as a pathway to "signature" scholarship works in the publication and presentation areas of your discipline. equally have observed and written glowing reports on your teaching. Student feedback in this regard is excellent with many students stating "She's one of the best professors I've had at AU so far!" It is clear that you fully embrace students' feedback from the course evaluations, which is reflected in your continuous work to improve and modify curriculum and instruction, especially as it relates to online education. Dr. Groman has completed extensive work with curriculum development projects which demonstrates your commitment to Ashland University's Gifted Education program.
