"The Creativity Project:

Practical Applications for Teachers of the Gifted"

(A graduate PD and research project sponsored by Ashland University)





Course Description

In this 15-week experience, students will be trained on the Piirto model of creativity. Students will research one aspect of the model in depth, write a curriculum application for use in their classroom, implement the application, and report on the results. Special attention will be given to writing WEP goals for students identified gifted in Creative Thinking Ability as specified by the Ohio Department of Education. This course allows students an opportunity to earn three graduate credit hours for their participation an instructor-led research project on creativity training. This course/experience is job-embedded with two required face-to-face Saturday sessions on Ashland University's Main Campus.

Requirements

Participants must be working K-12 educators (public or nonpublic) with a valid Ohio Gifted Intervention Specialist endorsement and have access to gifted students OR working gifted coordinators with access to gifted students.
