This Presentation includes

- ► Most educators seem to want online courses.
- All tends to get program inquiries after the semester has started (too late to enroll, too early to begin the next semester).
- ► A() tends to get program inquiries from singleton students (sometimes too far from campus or not part of a district that want to start a cohort).
- ► Prospective students want to know:
 - ► The cost commitment for the entire program;
 - ▶ The time commitment for the entire program.
- The proposed program models the kind of differentiation that we want our graduate students to engage in.

Rationale - Problems we need to solve within the Talent Development Program

With this proposal, AU's Talent Development Endorsement Program would have three distinct options:

- 1. Hybrid or online coursework in site-based cohorts.
- 2. Online coursework rotation.
- 3. Online Guided Independent Study (GIS) for Gifted Intervention Specialist (GIS) Endorsement.

The future of Ashland University's Talent Development Prøgram

- A Program Handbook outlines the expectations, technology requirements, planning guide, calendar
- ▶ Truly Independent: Students enter courses as they wish and take as much time as they need to complete it. There would be a minimum time (5 weeks) and maximum time (1 year) requirement to complete a course.
- ► Compact signed by the students requiring:
 - ▶ in-district collaboration;
 - ▶ attendance at the GIS Saturday Intensive at Main Campus each semester;
 - ▶ Skype, Facetime, or telephone conferences with instructor each semester.
- Courses are comprised of three modules
 - ► A Scope or Breadth Analysis of the content
 - ► A Depth Analysis of certain content
 - ► A Complexity Analysis and Personal Integration Project

Specific components of the GIS for GIS Program

- ► An APA Seminar prior to 650 or 651.
- ▶ Ongoing collaboration with a Gifted Coordinator, a Gifted Intervention Specialist, or a veteran teacher (preferably with experience with gifted) in their building or district. This could possibly allow us to enlist AU program graduates.
- ► Once a semester face-to-face Saturday Intensive at Main Campus:
 - ▶ 9am-5pm;
 - ► Lunch at Convo;
 - Morning speakers, afternoon session sharing their current work with the group.
 - ▶ This Intensive could be an outreach program for the College of Education open invitation for the morning speaker, afternoon workshops for non GIS attendees.
- ▶ Once a semester Skype, Face Time, or telephone meeting with the instructor/program director//
- Ongoing collection of artifacts for a GIS Resource Notebook to be reviewed during EDIS

Program Requirements

- An assigned | T person for assistance as needed.
- Program Director to meet with adjuncts to discuss updates to be made to 652, 653, 654, and 796, providing mileage, a small stipend, and lunch for these volunteer adjuncts.
- Program Director to provide a cost-study approximation for textbooks for the entire program so students can budget accordingly.

What is needed to create this program?

- A flexible online format that is not semester based, but always open, or open two to three times during the semester.
- ► A flexible course load protocol for the Program Director, as this would fall outside normal operating load requirements.
- A competitive flat rate cost statement for the GIS for GIS Endorsement program with tuition and fees.
- ► A financial allowance/budget for:
 - ► A keynote speaker for a Saturday Intensive each semester (approx. \$150.00).
 - For a Convolunch for GIS grad students during the Saturday Intensive each semester (approx. \$9.00 per student, which could be included in their fees).
 - Advertisements online and through the state and national gifted advocacy publications.
 - Advertisement of the Saturday Intensive morning keynote each semester to give all local teachers a chance to attend for CEUs.

What is needed to create this program?

- Personal Service. Students interact personally with course instructor at least twice a semester.
- ► Unique. Five universities in the United States have Guided Independent Study programs. None are in Ohio. None include Gifted Education.
- ▶ Balanced. This program includes a balance of independent work and collaboration with others.
- ▶ Independent. After the survey of course concepts in Module 1, students would set goals for their own learning in the course.
- ▶ Personalized. Modules 2 and 3 of each course would allow students to explore personally relevant content.
- ► Flexible. Students start when they wish and take as much time as they need.
