Overall some really excellent comments. I had the opportunity to meet each of these students in their classrooms for observations this semester, and it shows in the positive comments and their reflections on the power of this course on their teaching and learning. They appreciate doing the internship and lesson plans, and then getting real-time feedback on their lesson. They handled the time-management of the course well, better than previous students/semesters.

Only one comment. This student found the course challenging and all assignments were associated with the project and the project contributed to their learning.

Comments on Informal Evaluations (Pre- and Post-Assessments and Comments)

The Teacher-created pre- and post-assessments show the most improvement in using demographic information to respond to learners' needs and using lesson planning processes to create lessons and lessons that differentiate for gifted students.

As for their comments, they feel much more confident, overall, in their ability to differentiate and to notice when students need accommodations. They also state overwhelmingly how useful it is to have me come to their school to see them teach and give them feedback.
