PD Option. If you simply want 30 or 60 contact hours of HQPD to satisfy ODE new Rule requirements, we offer two choices:

PD Option 1. Fully Online Professional Development through AU's Founders College of Continuing Education program *Gifted Education for the General Education Teacher*. These are two 2-credit hour courses "Gifted and the General Education Teacher I" and "Gifted and the General Education Teacher II" offered completely online over 7 weeks, or a full year self-paced series of 2 courses, face-to face or hybrid. These are also offered over the summer or can be presented with your district or through an ESC. Tuition reduction is available for cohorts of 10 or more.

For teachers interested in continuing on toward a Gifted Intervention Specialist (GIS) Endorsement, completion of both Professional Development Modules can substitute for EDIS 650 "Nature and Needs of the Talented."

PD Option 2. Hybrid Graduate Coursework toward GIS Endorsement. Completion of EDIS 650, *Nature and Needs* of the Talented satisfies 45 contact hours of HQPD in the competencies outlined by ODE.

Teachers may wish to continue on toward GIS Endorsement with five more graduate courses in Talent Development.

Endorsement Option. If you are interested in a Gifted Intervention Specialist Endorsement, Hybrid Graduate Coursework is offered at Ashland University campuses and as a cohort in your district. The course sequence is:

EDIS 650 - Nature and Needs of the Talented

EDIS 651 - Curriculum Development for Education of the Talented

EDIS 652 - Development and Supervision of Programs for the Talented

EDIS 653 - Guidance and Counseling for the Talented

EDIS 654 - Creativity Studies for Teachers of the Talented

EDIS 796 - Field Practicum for Talent Development

Masters in Education (M.Ed.) Option. If you are interested in pursuing a graduate degree, we offer Hybrid, Face-to-Face and Online Coursework toward M.Ed. in Talent Development. After the foundational 18 credits for the Endorsement Option, you would continue with a 3 hour course in each of the four core areas: Curriculum Foundations, Social and Historical Foundations, Inquiry and Diversity. An APA Seminar, Elective Course and Capstone Experience round out the M.Ed coursework.
